3. Chair's Update

West Yorkshire ICS

The Palliative and EoLC Group is about to be formally recognised the Executive Group of the ICS as part of its structure.

The Group has a number of workstreams including digital, workforce, urgent care, medicines and metrics. We now have representation on all of them. Adam is attending the Palliative and EOLC Group on behalf of the LPCN. The agenda and minutes are being circulated more widely to the network through the LPCN office.

Strategy

Tom Daniels and Adam presented the strategy to the NHS Leeds CCG Executive Management Team on 20th January. It was generally positively received, the focus on diversity and equality was commended. The Team suggested more could be added with regard to the metrics already collected by the LPCN and this may be added as an appendix. The Strategy Advisory Group is meeting tomorrow (28th). The strategy will then go forward for publication.

4. Risk Register and Issues Log

Risk 2 - Capacity in Education Workforce

Trish Stockton has worked up a proposal for how the CCG funding might be spent. This was discussed by the LPCN Exec Team and the option to recruit a band 7 with band 4 administrative support was preferred. Trish will now create a job specification and begin the recruitment process.

Systems Issue 4 - Patient Information Systems

We are engaging with WY&H's digital solution. Leeds may be a pilot site.

Systems Issue 5 - New Syringe drivers

LTHT have released some 2nd edition drivers to LCH.

Leeds has responded to BD following their offer to replace pumps following concerns with the lead screw and ongoing battery issues.

System Issue 7 – EPaCCs Reports Metrics returns

The reports are being received more or less to time. The Informatics and Metrics Group has revised the data sharing agreement so that information can enable a better understanding of diversity and equality issues can be gathered.

7. Programme Update

Community Flows Improvement

The Community Flows Improvement Group met on 26th January, there were updates from Leeds Beckett and Healthwatch on the Whole Systems Approach project. The first drafts of the reports are almost ready. Healthwatch have heard some very powerful personal stories. In general the concerns raised reflected the issues also raised by the frontline staff in the workshops.

Dementia & EoLC

The final version of the bid for an Admiral Nurse Service has been signed off by the Dementia & EoLC Group and is now ready for the next stage towards being submitted to the CCG.

8. Member's Updates

Sue Ryder Wheatfields

Currently 10 - staff are off work with Covid but the cases are not linked. The hospice is open to admissions.

LCH

The Neighbourhood Teams are currently under great pressure. There has not been the same peak as in the first wave but there is steady pressure.

The Planning Ahead Template has launched on 25th January and the launch went smoothly.

Training videos will be available for GPs and community staff.

Further training for DNACPR signatories is in development.

A new document has been added to the LPCN website in the support for carers and families section. It is a useful checklist of people to consider contacting when someone has died.

SGH

There has been an outbreak of Covid on the IPU. Quite a few staff and patients have tested positive. All staff on site are being tested over the next 2 days with PCR tests.

The hospice is not closed but admissions are on a case by case basis.

Demand in the community has been very high and the Team were at capacity on Monday. Mostly the demand is symptom management and there is also significant carer strain.

There has been an increase in calls for advice from paramedics which has enabled them to keep some patients out of hospital.

LTHT

The number of Covid patients in the hospital has stayed more or less the same. There is some pressure due to a requirement to take some patients from other hospitals in the South.

The vaccination programme is continuing with high numbers of staff involved.

Villa Care

We are working to support where we can across the city. Another ward has been opened and the domiciliary team has been increased.

Staff have been excellent and risen to the occasion.
