#### 3. Chair's Update

There has been ongoing progress in the projects despite the holidays.

- The Leeds Dying Well in the Community Project is working with Seacroft PCN. Talks are beginning about another site on the other side of the city. The Single Point of Contact scoping is also progressing and will produce a report and options appraisal shortly.
- The Timely Recognition Tool project is also progressing. This will help to identify to Practices people who might benefit from an ACP conversation.

#### 4. Network Manager's Update

- The West Yorkshire EoLC Group now feeds into the Person Centred Care Board for West Yorkshire.

- There may be more health inequalities money available for bids from the Strategic Clinical Network. More information will be circulated when it is received. **Action 211**

#### 5. LPCN Bereaved Carers' Survey Report

Diane gave a presentation giving an overview of the latest report from the Citywide Bereaved Carers' Survey. (slides attached)

The report covered:

- People's experiences of end-of-life care for their relative or friend in a hospital, hospice and community (including GP surgeries, Leeds Community Healthcare and private care agencies and care homes)
- Over a period of three months, October to December 2021.

Responses were lower than in previous years

- A total of 115 people provided feedback across all the settings
- · This represents about 6% of the total number of deaths registered during this time
- Factors = Covid19 and electronic process
- (However) Increase in community and BAME responses

The report will be presented to the EOLC Population Board on 13<sup>th</sup> October.

An action plan will be agreed from the report recommendations

#### 6. EOLC Population Board

Jenny gave presentation giving an overview of the structure and role of the Population Boards within the ICB (slides attached)

The Board might be involved making decisions such as:

- •Where to allocate additional funding (LTP, ICS, transformation etc.)
- •Whether to disinvest from services that could be delivered in better ways
- •Which contracts can or should move toward outcomes-based risk sharing agreements
- •Which city-wide interventions should be a priority
- •Which target outcomes for their population are delivered through which sub-groups
- •Which metrics might be allowed to suffer a short-term decline for a long-term improvement

The EOLC Population Board is chaired by Gill Pottinger.

Adam has a non-voting seat at the Board as chair of the LPCN

The Board is supported by a Matrix Team within the Leeds Office of the ICB that Diane also attends.

To date most of the work of the Board has been in developing outcome statements and working through the underpinning logic model to determine relevant performance measures.

4 Statements have been agreed.

The board will look at the LPCN Programme and provide comment and challenge.

There are still some questions for the Board to consider including:

What workforce is in the scope of the Board?

How the population is confidently identified. (we know from GP records that on average 6-7K people die per year, the current identified population is approx. 3k)

All the Boards need to consider how the Boards will interact. Individuals may have a prominent need but sit across Boards.

How will the money be split?

How will 3<sup>rd</sup> sector independent providers be represented?

### 7. West Yorkshire PEOLC Group

Adam gave an overview of the EOLC Group within the West Yorkshire ICS. This group has been in existence for some time but has now been brought into the Person Centred Care Board workstream under Charlotte Goulding. The Group has drawn together an EOL programme plan (slide attached).

This has been developed independently from the work in Leeds but we have contributed.

There are still questions to work through about the level of integration between the ICB EOLC Board and the Person Centred Care Board and how the structures align.

The workforce workstream has also now expanded to cover the SCN patch across the North and Humber. It is important that work already undertaken is fed in and not lost.

From the finance point of view the bulk of the funding to support provider delivery is at place level. There is a small amount of money to support clinical leads with ICS level project work.

#### 8. Risk Register/Systems Issue Log

**Risk Register -** The risks around capacity in the education workstream and links with the structure of the ICS have been removed following the appointment of the LPCN Clinical Educator and the LPCN links to the ICB EOLC Board and the ICS Person Centred Care Board.

**Systems Issue 1 - Capacity –** It was noted that most systems are already at Opel3/3E and the coming winter will be extremely challenging. This is the current situation and not purely driven by Covid. Diane agreed to update the Issue – **Action 216** 

**Systems Issue 2 – Interoperability –** There are some trials going on between Harrogate Trust and Wetherby Community Nursing Services to exchange information in the Yorkshire & Humber Care Record.

Heather will ask Mike Stockton if he has an update - Action 217

The importance of interoperability has been escalated to the EOLC Board.

**Systems Issue 3 – Syringe Drivers –** The care home drivers have been delivered to Medical Physics. LCH and LTHT have each purchased 130. The manufacturers have offered some additional capacity to check the drivers prior to deployment and the details for this are currently being negotiated with possible support from the LPCN. The beneficial impact of having Diane to coordinate the process was noted by the group.

**Systems Issue 5 – EPaCCS Reports** - A timetable has been agreed for 2022-23 and Q4 2021-22 Planning Ahead Report has been produced.

#### **Finance Report**

Diane reported the LPCN is still in a reasonable financial position. The underspend is now being committed however, at a significant rate. We are waiting for final costings from LTHT for some banners to promote advance care planning. We have also received a business case to undertake an audit of ReSPECT in conjunction with the University of Leeds and AUPC. This has been approved in principle and we are waiting final costings.

We are hopeful of receiving an additional 70K from the NHSE/I National Team towards supporting the Leeds Dying Well in the Community Project, particularly the SPOC scoping.

Members were reminded about the available funding to support Leadership Training for people from diverse communities.

Member's attention was drawn to the Programme overview which details the activities of the LPCN.

**Sue Ryder Wheatfields –** Wheatfields remains without a Service Director.

Planning Ahead Coordinator – Jo has begun working with a care home in the LS25/26 PCN

Carers Leeds – On Monday 2 new patient flow carer support workers are starting based in the Transfer of care hub in LTHT. They will be primarily helping self-funders to move from community care beds to their preferred place of care.

LTHT- Covid is still affecting the hospital with 70 patients currently in the hospital with Covid.

Leeds Bereavement Forum - we have obtained funding to produce leaflets which will be circulated in October
