




LTHT ReSPECT Audit



- Data received from 33,896 ReSPECT plans, with 23,729 unique records
- Records from January 2019 September 2021
- Analysis focused on:
 - Trends in the creation of ReSPECT plans
 - Timing of ReSPECT plan creation
 - Completeness of ReSPECT plans




Trends in the creation of LTHT ReSPECT plans

Timing of LTHT ReSPECT plan creation




Completeness of ReSPECT plans

Category of completeness	Content
Level 1: Minimally useful content	 Patient involvement (mandatory) CPR recommendation (mandatory) Treatment escalation - at least one of four free-text boxes has text in Preferred place of death
Level 2: Intermediate Quality	 Level 1 items, alongside: Diagnosis Prognosis Insight patient insight carer
Level 3: Comprehensive	 Level 1 and 2 items, alongside: Preferred place of care ADRT Advance Statement Lasting power of attorney for health and welfare
Non-complete	Not meeting Level 1
*For all above any option could be selected including unknown/undecided etc

ReSPECT community audit

- LPCN-funded project
- Use of ReSPECT across settings has steadily increased during the pandemic
- Audits have been undertaken within LTHT and St Gemma's Hospice
- Academic Unit of Palliative Care undertaking audit of community ReSPECT

ReSPECT community audit

Aim: Identify what is working well, recommend improvements to promote and inform future training and development requirements

- Part 1: Completion of ReSPECT Forms by community clinicians within LCH, hospices and primary care
- Part 2: Patient experience of the ReSPECT process irrespective of who completed the form and in what care setting in Leeds
- Part 3: Professional confidence and competence in the ReSPECT process across care settings

Analysis of Planning Ahead data

- All deaths (n=7,363) in Leeds from September 2021 to September 2022
- Determine who had EPaCCS inclusion, ReSPECT plan, both or neither at death
- Influence of sociodemographic and clinical characteristics on receiving either EPaCCS or ReSPECT



Leeds Timely Recognition Tool

The Early Tool was initially devised by NW and promoted by the National P&EOL Team

Received funding from NE & Yorkshire SCN & Leeds CCG Frailty Scheme.

Our initial aim was to validate this search tool for primary care systems, to support our EOL outcome to recognise people approaching EOL & to allow timely advance care planning conversations.



Project Team: LPCN, ICB Leeds, Primary Care clinicians & Leeds University.

IG sign off.

Identified a PCN with low recognition of pts approaching EOL

Validation tool formed and used by clinicians.

EMIS searches run and patients validated

S1 – new tool needed as EARLY



Next Steps

- 1. Completion of System 1 searches
- 2. Transfer of data to Matthew Allsop to assess.
- 3. Follow up with practices on outcome of searches and feasibility of having the conversations.
- 12m after initial search to compare list generated with the patients who have died in that time period.
