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














BCS Action Plan 21-22

- Provide end of life care training to ensure a consistent approach across all LTHT services
- Continue to embed the principles of the SUPPORT campaign to ensure families of dying patients are given information about care available for them
- GP support in last weeks of life
- Review the EOL information provided to patients and families across all community providers
- Staff training in Hospice
- Provide specific feedback to care homes



BCS 2023

- 6th year of the survey
- Survey of bereaved carers of adults who died
 1.2.23 30.4.23
- Across all organisations LTHT, both hospices,
 LYPFT, LCH and care homes
- Measure the quality of care delivered to patients across Leeds – last days of life
- Project supported by Healthwatch Leeds

Questions re location of care, pain and symptom management, ACP, religious and cultural support, respecting wishes, privacy and dignity, personal care

Satisfaction re services working together, involvement in care decisions, location of place of death

BCS 2023

- Distribution through the registrars office
- Option to complete online or paper version or telephone via Healthwatch
- Prompts sent to increase RR (A6 flyer, A4 Poster)
- Wide communication plan
- Survey open until end June 2023

Total no. of responses received: 103


Hospital: 28

White Irish: 3, (3.16% of


responses)
