



When Someone Dies


Information on what to do after someone dies





This leaflet uses easy words and pictures.


You might want to ask someone to help you read it.




This leaflet might help you after someone close to you has died.



When someone dies, their death will need to be confirmed by a doctor or healthcare professional.




This will be arranged by a healthcare professional as soon as possible.



You will need a **funeral director**. The person who has died might have already chosen one.



The **funeral director** will support you to arrange the funeral.




The funeral director will then care for the person who has died. They might take them to a funeral home.




All deaths needs to be registered with a **registrar**.


A **registrar** is a person who works for the council. They register every birth, death and marriage.




A doctor will complete the Medical Certificate of Cause of Death (MCCD).



A **Medical Examiner** will check this information and send it to the Registrar. A **Medical Examiner** is a senior doctor.



The Medical Examiner Service will contact the family or Next of Kin of the person who has died.



They will ask if there are any questions or concerns about the death.

This will be a telephone call, or sometimes a meeting.




The registrar will contact you to book an appointment. This will be in their office. Tell them if you need any reasonable adjustments.



They will give you a death certificate. This is a very important document.




If equipment was provided this will

need to be collected.


A healthcare professional will

The person who died might have written a **Will**.


They might have planned and paid for their funeral. If they have not done this, ask for support.



There are some benefits available for funeral costs.


Ask whoever usually supports you

with your finances to help.



You may need to tell different organisations. The registrar can tell you more about this.

Bereavement is your experience and feelings when someone dies.




Grief is the feeling of loss or losing someone after they die.




People can have lots of different feelings during this time.


These feelings might come and go.
